On August 28, despite the after-effects of Hurricane Irene lurking around Richmond—including over 75% of the Richmond area without power—St. Edward-Epiphany Catholic School successfully swung open our red, front doors for the new family Ambassador Picnic, marking the 50th Anniversary school year. In fact, we had a record crowd of new families and hosting families in attendance.

Several days after the students were all settled into new classrooms and acquainted with their teachers, alumnus and present parent, Steve Eliasek '82, hosted the 50th Anniversary pep rally for 444 students and faculty. Steve received many genuine and sincere rounds of applause as he shared fond memories of his time here as a student, including a playground tussle with another student who remains his friend today. It was obvious to all present that Steve's love for our School is a compilation of endearing memories and reflective gratitude for his formation as a caring, compassionate, Catholic adult in today's world.

I believe that St. Edward-Epiphany Catholic School has served so many students—many of whom are now successful adults—in the past, the present and will continue to do so in the future, because our School's mission remains constant. We are here to share the four pillars of the kingdom of God His word, worship, community and service. This is all because the teacher introduced "Illustrated Classics" to her students. This mother was beyond belief that her son wants to stay up late at night to read *Tom Sawyer*.

On Sunday, November 6, at 1:00 p.m., St. Edward-Epiphany Catholic School will celebrate our 50 Years of Faith and Excellence with a liturgy at St. Edward Church. Dr. Lou Ross "Candy" Hopewell Educated Many, Created History



Principal of St. Edward-Epiphany Catholic School from 1979-1986, Dr. Lou Ross "Candy" Hopewell passed away on July 2, 2011. She was 65.

Born and raised in Portsmouth, Va., Dr. Hopewell worked as an educator for over 40 years. Raised as a Methodist who later converted to

Catholicism, Dr. Hopewell believed strongly in the Catholic educational system. She earned degrees from Elon University and Old Dominion University, and a doctorate from the College of William and Mary.

After her tenure at St. Edward-Epiphany, Dr. Hopewell founded the co-educational Blessed Sacrament School at the Belmead Estate in Powhatan, Va., on holdings that spanned 1,600 acres, owned by the Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament.

Belmead Estate—built by slaves for plantation owners—was first transformed by the Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament into two private schools for African American and Native American students. The schools closed in the 1970s, and Dr. Hopewell then founded Blessed Sacrament at Belmead in 1987, and held classes in its 23-room mansion that predated the Civil War.

Blessed Sacrament's initial enrollment of eighth and ninth grades had 18 students, which grew to 140 students in grades six through 12 by 1997. Dr. Hopewell was so determined to help the School succeed, that she garnered support from parents to enlarge classes, and performed a huge variety of campus chores—she was principal, and she also cut the expansive lawn, cleaned buildings, and drove the school's bus.

As Dr. Hopewell then told a reporter, "We do not aim to be an exclusive school economically, we aim to be an exclusive school in terms of quality."

In 1998, Blessed Sacrament joined with Huguenot Academy in Powhatan, moved locations, and became known as Blessed Sacrament Huguenot.

Dr. Hopewell also served as an English Professor at Tidewater Community College. She was an active member of St. John Neumann Catholic Church in Powhatan, and worked with the Girl Scouts for over 25 years.

"Candy was a visionary educational leader, always caring for the students and faculty entrusted to her care," said Georgette Richards, St. Edward-Epiphany principal. "She led with passion and humor. We have lost a great leader and woman of faith," she added.

"Candy was a pioneer in many ways and at the heart of her passion was helping children to receive a Catholic education," said Miriam Cotton, assistant superintendent of Catholic Schools.

A memorial fund has been established in Dr. Hopewell's name at Blessed Sacrament Huguenot School.

Technology is a beautiful thing! In our ever-changing world, St. Edward-Epiphany Catholic School prides itself on maintaining a cutting edge atmosphere to better enhance students' learning opportunities. Our School Board is committed to funding our technology plan, which addresses our technological needs throughout our School, as well as projecting our needs for the future.

This summer, our entire computer lab was updated with BEAUTIFUL new desktops. The CPUs run at "warp speed," and the monitors display stunning images, offering our students the highest quality tools to enhance their learning. The former lab machines were updated completely and distributed to faculty and staff. We also have a new lab printer, offering double-sided printing, assisting us at report card time and with printing daily student projects.

We have added additional projectors to classrooms to share internet-based content with students. Our 50-plus laptops remain an invaluable asset as well, and plans to purchase five student iPads should soon come to fruition. We procured a large HD television to utilize in the intermediate division for video streaming, giving teachers the ability to share content with the entire group in a classroom setting.

The faculty and staff immensely appreciate the parents' support that we receive daily, as we strive to provide the best learning environment possible to challenge and enhance student learning.



Did YOU Know?

St. Edward-Epiphany Catholic School Fun Facts

- St. Edward School was built in 1961, on land that was originally part of a 395-acre farm, which was also once used as a plant nursery.
- The School held its first classes at Marymount Convent on Cary Street. For a few months, the only teachers were Sister diSienna and Mother Oliver from the Religious of the Sacred Heart of Mary.
- St. Edward's School was the first two-story elementary school in the Richmond area. In September 1964, the basement and two-story addition to the school were completed, and the first graduation was held in June of 1966. It was not until June of 1969 that the School graduated students who had attended classes since the first grade.
- The School's first bus—built in 1958—was so noticeably decrepit that students nicknamed it the "58 Crate."
- Uniforms were not required when St. Edward's School first opened. The first uniforms for girls included plaid "Scottish" style hats and clip-on bow ties. Boys were also required to wear plaid ties.
- Sister Presentation was a beloved nun who taught fourth grade students for many years. Sister would leave the convent at 5:00 a.m. to cross the Huguenot Bridge to avoid traffic!
- After the sisters withdrew from St. Edward's School, the Parish Office became the St. Edward Church priests' rectory. There was a terrible fire in the rectory at 2:00 a.m. on July 26, 1972, but no one was hurt. The fire caused \$50,000 worth of damage.
- Boy Scout Troop 893 first began at the School in 1963. The Gazebo located behind the Parish office is an Eagle Scout project donated by Patrick Acker '07.
- Popular days at St. Edward's School in the 1970s included "hamburger day" and "hotdog day." McDonald's hamburgers and cheeseburgers were served on Tuesdays and hotdogs with chips and a cupcake were served on Thursdays.
- In 1979, St. Edward's School became a regional school and was renamed St. Edward-Epiphany School. Dr. Lou Ross "Candy" Hopewell was principal from 1979-1986.
- The School's traditional Fall Festival was once called the Fall Carnival, and featured a real Ferris wheel.
- The St. Edward-Epiphany School uniform has changed colors and plaids three times. The first sweaters and knee socks were gray, then maroon, and now red, minus the knee socks.
- About 35 years ago, the School participated in a mock fire drill, with the fire department, policemen and news crews called to the scene. Students imitated injuries and were "rescued" by firefighters, including some who were lowered from windows via ladder trucks.
- Ms. Richards first worked at St. Edward-Epiphany School as a seventh and eighth grade science and math teacher, and has served as principal for over 25 years.
- The St. Edward-Epiphany Class of 2012 will be the 47th class to graduate from the School, and the current fifth grade class, or Class of 2015, will celebrate as the 50th graduating class.
