


There is also a separate reading assignment included in this packet for your child to complete.

On Book Day, please have your child return the completed reading assignment and the packet to their 3rd grade homeroom teacher.



Students are encouraged to pick up a good book and to enjoy! Students may also enjoy reading with a family member and sharing the experience!





#### What is a JUST RIGHT book?


- I read my book smoothly. (I do not sound like a robot. I sound like someone talking).

- I am constantly **thinking** about what I am reading, asking questions, and making predictions.








